R. 1256 would authorize the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to regulate tobacco products, and would require the agency to assess fees on manufacturers and importers of tobacco products to cover the cost of FDA's new regulatory activities authorized by the bill. Such fees could be collected and made available for obligation only to the extent and in the amounts provided in advance in appropriation acts. The bill also contains provisions that affect direct spending and revenues associated with the retirement benefits of federal employees. CBO estimates that: Implementing the bill would increase spending subject to appropriation, on net, by about 0.1 billion over the 2010 - 2014 period and by 0.8 billion over the 2010...
